Makokibatan is an 18-mile lake that is fed by the cool, clear waters of the Albany River, and a highly sought-after destination by wilderness enthusiasts and anglers alike. Makokibatan Lodge is located on the Albany and is one of

Ontario's most renowned trophy fishing destinations, backed by over 20 years of continuous operation. The weed beds on the lake's north shore are great for pike, the rocky southern shore is home to many trophy-sized walleyes, and the Albany is famous for access to superb brook trout fishing. Complete with six full-service log cabins, Makokibatan Lodge is sure to keep you comfortable, well fed, and well rested.
